**RE:** COVID-19 Update

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## **Introduction:**

As directed by a majority of the Council during the April 20, 2021 meeting, this memo is intended to replace the information previously shared as a presentation item during regular Council meetings. Staff is available to answer questions related to this update via email, and case-related information can be accessed via the COVID-19 dashboard [HERE](#) at any time.

This report is formatted to provide updated information on local vaccination efforts in addition to several metrics used to evaluate the current condition of the pandemic within our community including cumulative case summary, county level COVID-19 hospitalizations, active cases, daily new case, vaccinated vs unvaccinated, and weekly fatality rate.

## **Vaccine opportunities:**

According to the Department of State Health Services (DSHS):

- 342,606 doses of vaccine have been administered by Hays County providers
- 91,328 doses have been administered in San Marcos
- 76.07% of Hays County residents age 5 and older have received one dose (State avg. 74.23%)
- 64.48% age 5+ have been fully vaccinated (State avg. 62.73%)
- 93.80% of residents over the age of 65 have been fully vaccinated. (State avg 83,83%)

Active cases have spiked in the past few two weeks. These cases have also increased hospital numbers. The hospital stays are shorter than with the initial COVID 19 cases. The recovery numbers have also increased, while the fatality rate has not increased.

**Vaccines**

Hays County has administered 342,606 doses of the vaccine. San Marcos accounts for 91,328 doses administered. Fully vaccinated in San Marcos is 42,843. These numbers show a slowdown of doses delivered to the public.

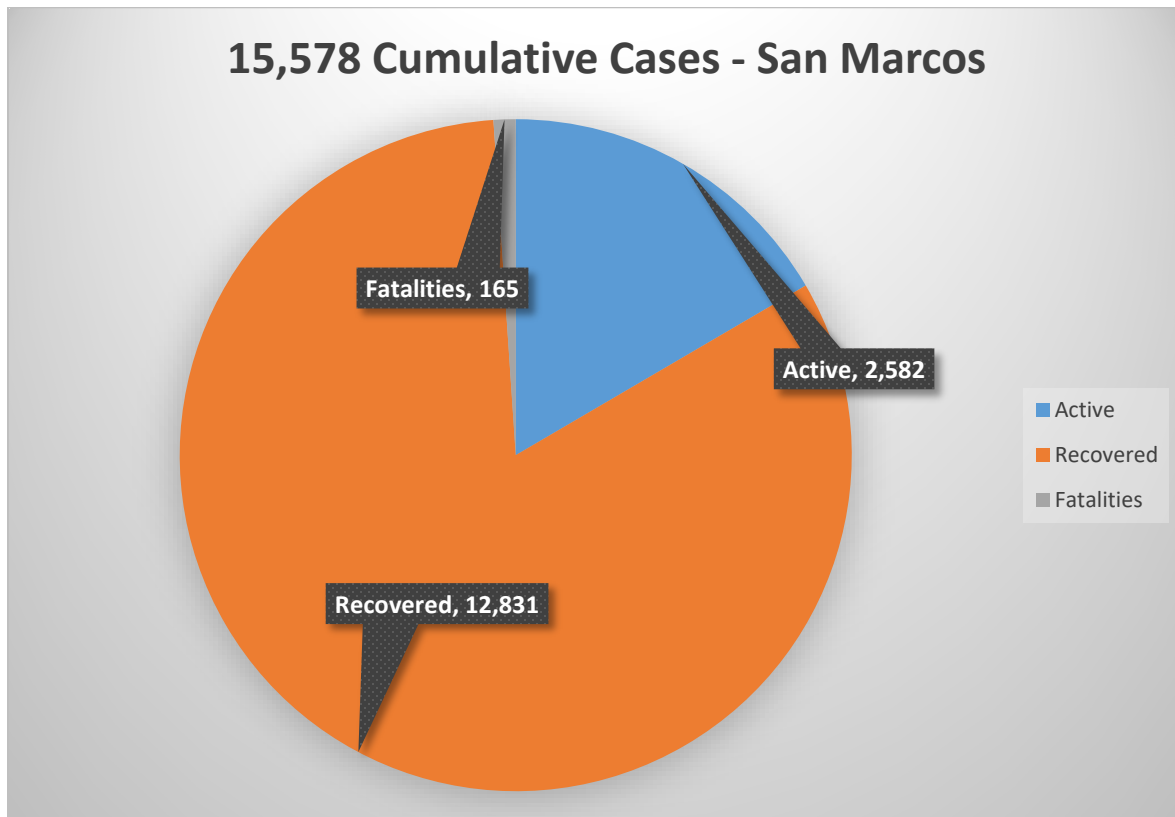

## Case Metrics:

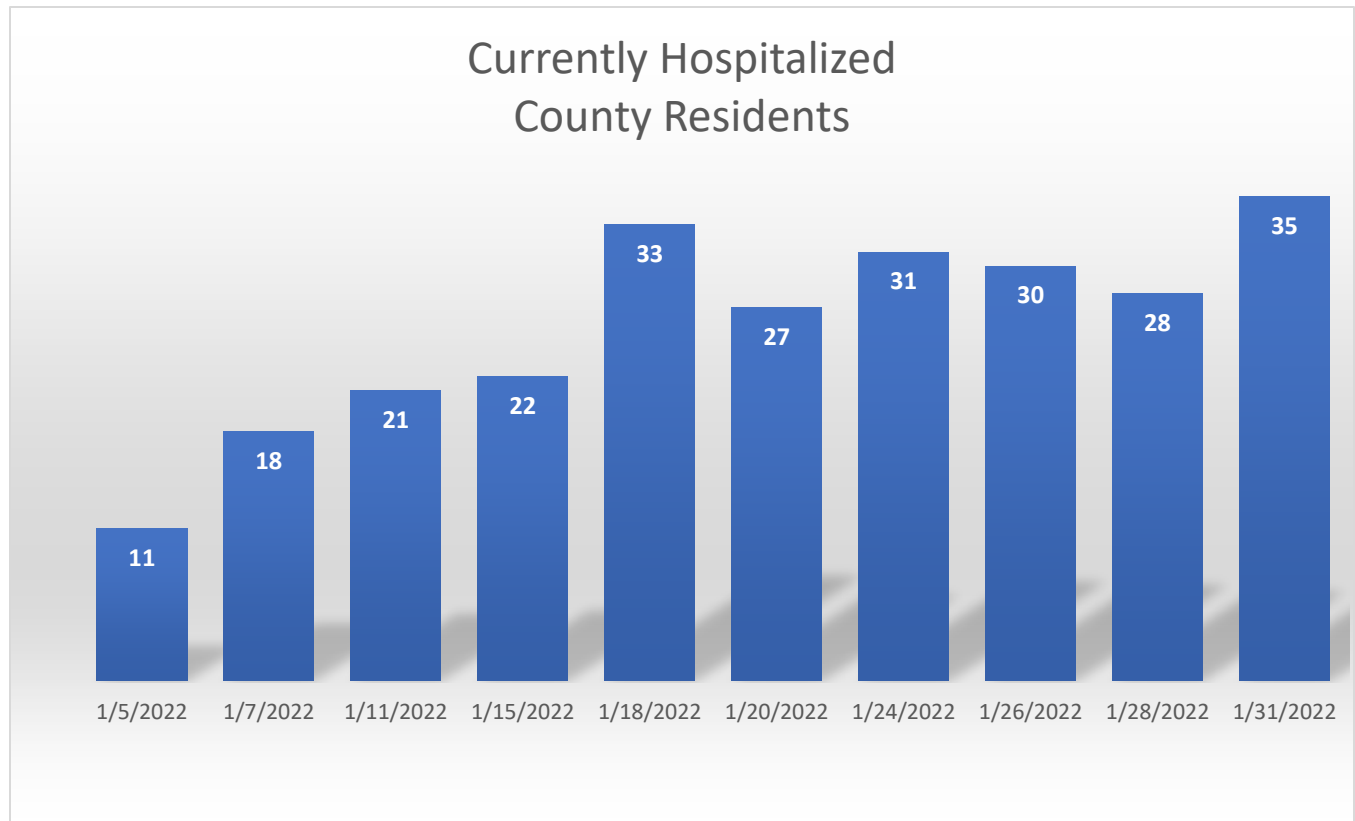
The following metric demonstrates the distribution of the total COVID-19 cases that have been recorded since March, 2020 of San Marcos residents.

The following graphic represents the total number of Hays County residents hospitalized for complications related to COVID-19 over the past month.

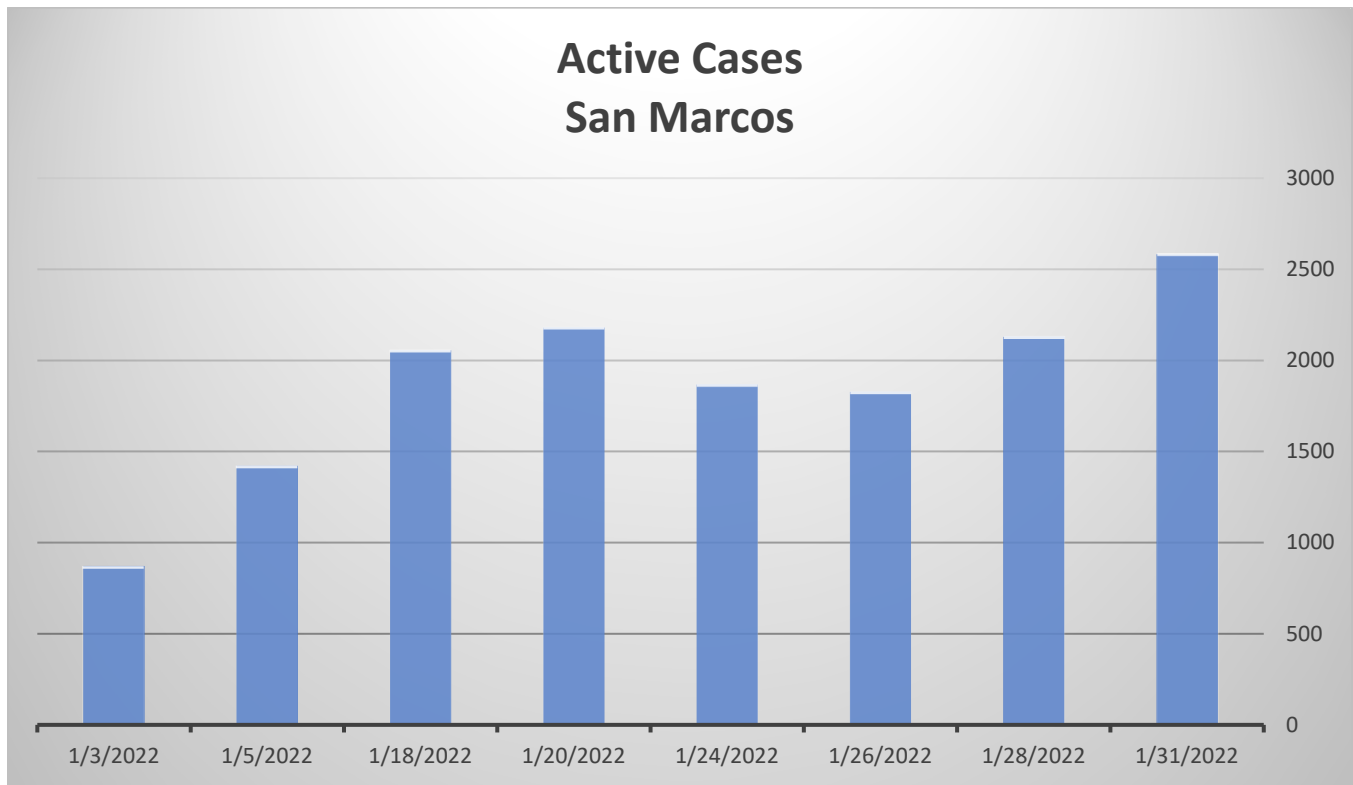

We continue to see a dramatic increase in active cases over the month.

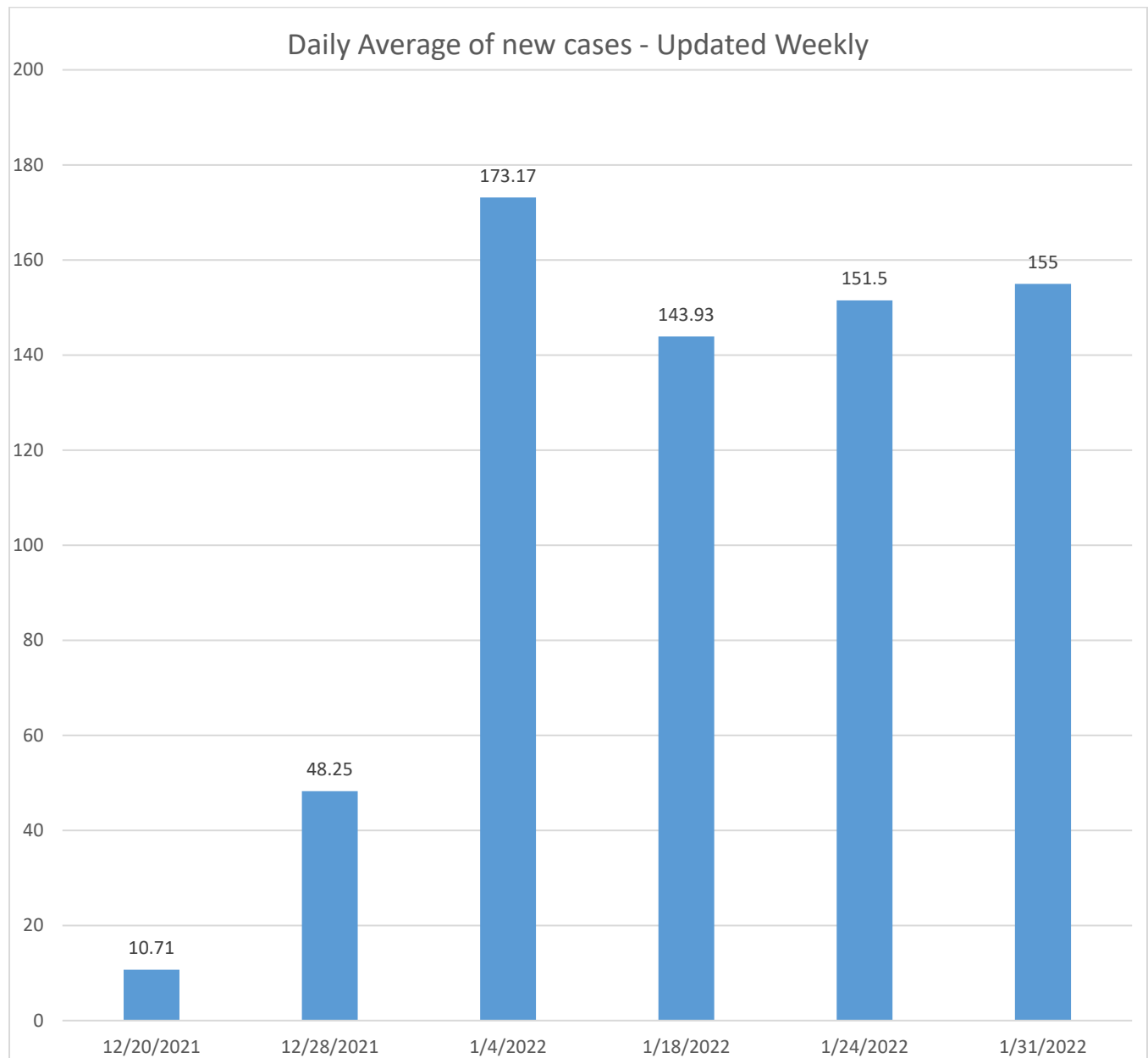


## Hays County Case Distribution by Gender and Ethnicity:

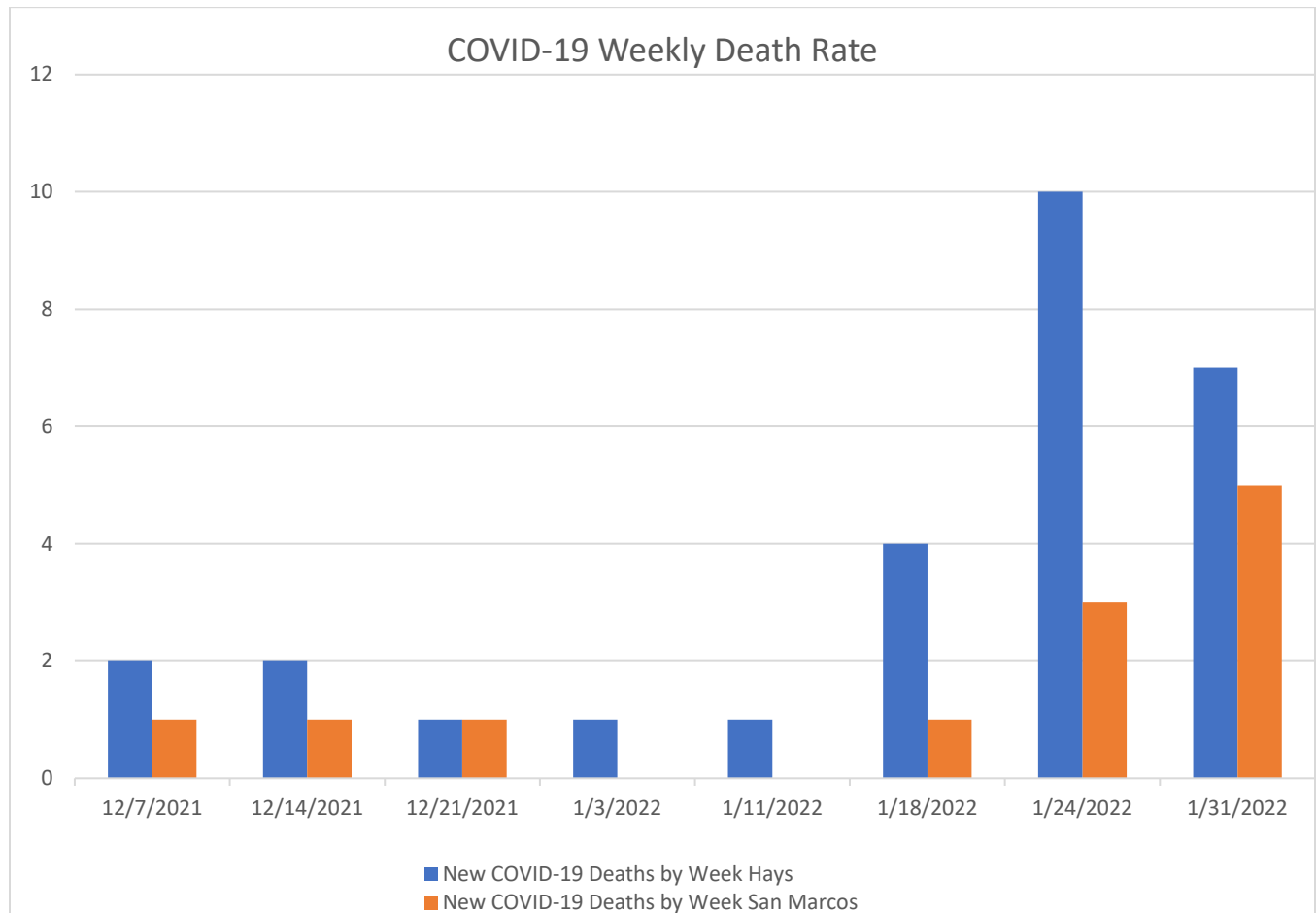
## San Marcos Daily New Cases

## COVID Weekly Fatality Rate

During the week of 24-28 January 2022 there were seven COVID-related deaths of Hays County resident and five in San Marcos. The age of the fatalities in San Marcos are 1-30's, 1-40's, 1-60's, 1-70's and 1-90's.



### Summary:

Texas has seen a huge spike in Omicron cases. San Marcos hospital cases have increased; however, the length of stays is much shorter, and we are seeing an increase in those who have recovered. This is a double edge sword in that hospital surge is high, but recovery is also at an all-time high.

Test kits have been supplied to all San Marcos employees and we have provided at least 1400 kits to the public. We shall stay vigilante and continue with the promotion of getting vaccinated and providing test kits if they are available.
